z. UNA SERATA SIMPATICA

So, so ... ich bin ihr also sympathisch. Ich habe mal gehört, dass eine Frau in Italien einen Mann als **simpatico** bezeichnet, wenn sie ihn sehr nett findet, aber sie könnte sich auch für ihn interessieren. Ein gutes Zeichen! Ich konnte nicht anders, als mich zu bedanken und das Kompliment zu erwidern.

„Grazie, anche tu sei simpatica!“, sagte ich. Dieses Mal konnte ich sie wirklich mit einem perfekten Satz überraschen. Schließlich hatte sie mir kurz zuvor, als wir aus dem Wasser kamen, beigebracht, dass man die beiden Wörter in dieser Reihenfolge sagt: **anche tu. Anche** bedeutet *auch* und steht immer vor einem Pronomen.

Um sicher zu sein, dass ich alles richtig verstanden hatte, rekapitulierte ich noch einmal kurz, was sie gesagt hatte, bevor ich antwortete. Also ... sie wollte mit mir feiern und essen gehen. Genau, wir sind uns sympathisch, das muss gefeiert werden. A **cena**, das wusste ich: *zum Abendessen*. Die

drei wichtigsten Mahlzeiten hatte ich mir gemerkt. **La colazione** – *das Frühstück*, **il pranzo** – *das Mittagessen* und **la cena** – *das Abendessen*. Dann sagte sie in **un piccolo ristorante** ... *in einem kleinen Restaurant* und fügte **sul porto** hinzu. Das letzte Wort kannte ich nicht. Ich wiederholte es mit einem eindeutigen Fragezeichen in der Stimme:

„**Porto?**“

Francesca sah mich an, als wäre ich ein Außerirdischer, und legte wieder los:

„Ma sì, il porto... le barche... se il porto è grande ci sono le navi, i traghetti... il porto, hai capito?“
